- 1609 Henry Hudson embarks to find a passage to Asia
- 1668 The first horse race in America
- 1776 Continental Congress authorizes a medal for George Washington
- 1807 British Parliament abolishes slave trade throughout British Empire
- 1813 Frigate USS Essex flies first US flag in battle in the Pacific

"Declared Disciples"

Nevertheless many, even of the authorities, believed in him. But because of the Pharisees they didn't confess it, for fear that they'd be put out of the synagogue; for they loved human glory more than the glory that comes from God. (John 12:42-43)

How many disciples might Jesus have had if men and women were bold enough to declare themselves as such? The twelve disciples that have been forever recorded in the pages of history might have been joined by dozens, even hundreds more. Jesus's teachings touched this many, for sure, but there was one problem. Like the "rulers" described in John 12, many of those whom he touched were afraid to say it for fear of ridicule and shame.

Perhaps they received some small private benefit from Jesus's words. But imagine what more God could have done through those rulers if they stepped out in faith and declared, "I am your disciple." Whenever we have the opportunity, today or in the future, let us boldly declare our status as followers of Christ. And let history record that we were not ashamed.

Dear God, let the private love I feel for you find ways to express itself publicly. Present me with an opportunity to let my brothers and sisters know how I feel about you. Amen.


